
Northland Village improvements - some ideas for council to improve our suburban centre



Northland Village Context:

Creswick Village, Northland, is a ridgeline connection between the central city, Kelburn, Wilton and Karori. The village is a small suburban centre on the 22 bus route and within a series of parks (Otari - Wilton's Bush, Town Belt, Ian Galloway Park, Zealandia, and Wellington Botanic Garden).

The shops are marked by a number of takeaway outlets, as a consequence the area has a rapid turnover of traffic. Coexistent with this traffic, are a number of community facilities, such as St. Anne's Church and Hall, the Northland Memorial Community Centre on Woburn Road, Northland School and Northland Park.

Northland Village Issues:

- 1. shops are generally fast food creating traffic congestion in evenings
- 2. demand for short term parking at peak times
- 3. poor connections between village and community memorial hall
- 4. village has no public flat area
- 5. local water supply is at risk following an earthquake
- 6. bus stop in shops confuses traffic and potentially unsafe
- 7. Garden Rd left turn is tight and potential traffic hazard
- 8. rubbish from fast food doesn't fit in bins
- 9. village feels tired and neglected

Northland Village Improvements:

- 1. create public space on pocket park integrated with new bus shelter
- 2. rainwater tank local resilience provision
- 3. improve path to community hall lighting and planting
- 4. increase parking generally provide car parking on shady side of street
- 5. area for outdoor seating on sunny side of street (outside tables for future cafe / parking)
- 6. pave Northland Road traffic calming shared space
- 7. move bus stop? and pedestrian crossing / add pedestrian crossing
- 8. ease left turn into Garden Rd
- 9. provide bins that suit fast food (pizza boxes)
- 10. new village gateway signage
- 11. community notice board new location?
- 12. Northland Community Centre enclose entry forming an outdoor verandah, constructed of lightweight danpalon polycarbonate, to produce a transparent entrance space and shelter in front of the community centre. The aim is to increase the flat space outside the centre to allow for community gatherings - potential to extend paving across street as potential temporary street market etc.
